Read how the NCCF and our partner affiliate foundations serve North Carolina in unique ways, with untold contributions to our state's quality of life and vital infrastructures.

**Reflecting our Networks:** Philanthropy is no longer the exclusive preserve of a privileged few. Those who participate in the joys of giving now reflect the demographics of our society in general and North Carolina in particular. You'll see how gifts great and small, from philanthropists who reflect both genders from every age and with growing diversity make an impact. The NCCF has programs to encourage giving among many groups that are emerging as important sources of charitable giving, including women and youth. The changing face of philanthropy is of course best reflected in the people we serve, partner with and employ: the donors, grant-recipients, leaders, volunteers and associates who have built the North Carolina Community Foundation over the last two decades.

**Generations of Givers:** Much is written about the great transfer of wealth from one generation to another. We are also witnessing the transfer of values from one generation to the next. This section shows how family philanthropy is strong and growing within the NCCF.

As we enter our third generation, the North Carolina Community Foundation remains poised to further cultivate philanthropy through our role as stewards of our state's vast resources, partners in community development and leaders in leveraging capacity.

# The Letter

One of the most rewarding aspects of our work at the North Carolina Community Foundation is the opportunity to meet so many of the people who are doing great things in their communities across our state. While these philanthropists all share a sense of altruism and a strong inclination toward generosity, most striking is what they don't have in common. This year's report theme illustrates that point. After meeting some of our donors, funders and volunteers and reading about their stories in the pages that follow, you'll see that there is not just one "face of philanthropy." These profiles of giving are as varied as the people who make up our population, crossing all socio-economic groups, ignoring color, gender and even defying age. We can learn from them all.

Consider the lesson taught by Kersten Paxton. This Arapahoe Charter School student used a class assignment to see what \$1 in seed money could do for her small coastal community. She paid it forward, and the stunning result was a \$130.68 donation to the Pamlico County Community Foundation for the Dottie Gray Ambulance Fund. The significance of her three-week effort to grow \$1 into a much needed community reinvestment will live on forever – and illustrates both the simplicity and the legacy of a gift to the NCCF. The significance of her contribution is explained further on page six.

We are delighted that Kersten's efforts and thousands of donors from across our fine state allow us to report another record year of giving. Grant and scholarship disbursements at March 31, 2008, totaled more than \$6 million, a 24 percent increase over last year. We awarded 1,400 grants, an eight percent increase over the previous year.

None of the Foundation's work would be possible without the generous support of our donors

and affiliate partners throughout North Carolina. We received more than \$18 million in gifts this past year, bringing our total assets to \$117 million.

Stewardship at any level requires responsibility. Each of us has a role to play in helping to ensure that community needs are discovered and met – and that our causes are defined and funded. It is our distinct honor at the NCCF to play a role in helping individuals, families and organizations discover their philanthropic passions and leverage giving to its maximum potential.

One reason we believe we're effective in this role is our presence throughout most of North Carolina. One of the NCCF's core advantages is our unique statewide network, which now serves 65 counties with 59 affiliates. Our mission to focus on rural, often under-served areas also has contributed to our ability to grow and flourish, and we will continue to capitalize on this strength.

You've already read about our impressive number of grants, allocations and assets. Growth in these areas and others has prompted us to make some strategic organizational changes to better align our services to affiliates, donors and constituents statewide. To that end, we have realigned positions, strengthened processes and introduced services. Realignments include:

- The position of Vice President of Affiliate Services, developed to enhance our partnerships and increase efficiencies with fund-holders and affiliates across North Carolina;
- The position of Director of Donor Engagement, established to evaluate, define and improve the overall giving experience with the NCCF;
- The position of Director of Marketing and Communications, created to raise awareness about the NCCF and implement strategies to increase resources and use of our services.

We also have introduced an on-line giving option to help make giving convenient, available at [nccommunityfoundation.org](http://nccommunityfoundation.org).

Our number-one goal through these new endeavors is to make your association with the NCCF gratifying and easy, whether you're a donor, fund-holder, volunteer or grantee working with our team of professionals at the state office or any one of our partner foundations throughout North Carolina.

We also want NCCF fund-holders and donors to be assured of the exacting standards that govern the administration of their resources. We are proud that the NCCF has achieved the highest ranking from Charity Navigator, an objective nonprofit rating service. The Foundation earned top ratings by exceeding requirements in several areas, including operational quality, financial efficiency and integrity, accountability and growth in program services.

Now at the 20 year mark, we can truly appreciate the Foundation's long-term perspective and insistence on safety, soundness and a conservative investment strategy, which are serving us well in these uncertain economic times.

While the NCCF's metrics remain solid, we need to temper future expectations with a dose of reality. We've already witnessed the impact of stock-market volatilities, and the economy's future remains uncertain. As always, be assured that prudent portfolio management and our continued reliance on safety and soundness will guide our philosophies.

Building lasting and meaningful partnerships with our affiliate networks and donors remains central to our future, as does our focus on rural, under-served areas. We also will continue to emphasize programming that encourages philan-

# State of Generosity

**The** North Carolina Community Foundation works to cultivate philanthropy throughout our state. With 59 affiliates supporting 65 counties across North Carolina, the very expanse of our network makes us unique.

The NCCF's focus on rural communities also sets us apart. Our tradition of serving the state with a focus on under-served areas means that the Foundation and our affiliate partners make vital contributions to our state's infrastructure and quality of life. The vast list of qualifiers that contributes to any community's livability runs the gamut from emergency services to education, the arts, historic preservation and environmental protection. Countless funds and endowments have been established with the Foundation and affiliates to support all of these areas and much more.

## Disaster relief

Consider the relief funds that have been established with the Foundation in so many North Carolina communities in the wake of natural disasters. Timely grant-making is critical to recovery efforts, with potential for long-term impact on communities' abilities to rebound. Many, like funds set up with Carteret and Macon affiliates after particularly destructive hurricanes, stand ready for the next disaster. Grant-making procedures are in place and ongoing donations encouraged.

Some communities have taken a proactive approach, establishing emergency funds before disaster strikes. The Northern Albemarle Community Foundation is working to create the first regional relief fund to support 14 counties in North Carolina's northeastern corner. The Albemarle Disaster Relief Fund will primarily distribute proceeds to the Food Bank of the

Albemarle and the Greater Albemarle Red Cross. A Feb. 28 Mardi-Gras dinner/dance fund-raiser is planned for 2009.

## Meeting needs

Matching foundation resources with community needs is an important affiliate goal at all times, not just during disaster.

Affiliate foundations in Greene and Lenoir counties are working hard to engage their respective communities and promoting their unrestricted funds as the best way to meet area needs. United Gift Funds established in both Swain and Jackson counties serve as important community-wide fund drives to bolster programs in each of these mountain areas.

The barely two year-old Cary Community Foundation is already known as a go-to organization. The affiliate saw applications more than



double this year, with a focus on funding initiatives that support children, families and the arts.

The generous Richard Chapman Cleve Fund, held with the Craven County Community Foundation, allowed the affiliate to quadruple its number of grants to support community initiatives this year. The fund supports a wide range of programs, including student mentoring through Big Brothers Big Sisters, indigent health care and reading services for the visually impaired.

The Montgomery County Fund really knows how to match needs with local resources. The 15-member board, half of whom hold their own funds, worked the phones to match specific community needs with donors. The effort more than doubled the number of grants they were able to

make this year.

Circumstances like poverty or just plain bad luck can turn a hand-up into a life-line. A stellar example of generosity is the Anne and Alex Bernhardt Foundation, established with the Catawba Valley Community Foundation (CVCF) to support citizen needs in the economically depressed foothills area. Alex Bernhardt, who serves on the CVCF board, heads one of the largest family-owned furniture companies in the country, in operation since 1889.

### Emergency services

The NCCF also holds countless funds that make critical emergency services possible or certainly more effective.

Thanks to a grant from the Cary Community Foundation, handicap-accessible picnic tables are now available for all Adams Elementary School students to enjoy under the shelter on campus.



Hickory's historic high school now serves as a compound that houses nonprofits, museums, a library and more. The Unifour Foundation has provided significant resources for the SALT Block, which stands for Sciences, Arts and Literature Together!

Vance and Granville county affiliates have donated funds to local municipal ambulance stations to allow equipment purchases for search and rescue operations.

Dottie Gray's friends and family established an ambulance fund in her name with the Pamlico County Community Foundation after she tragically died from a stroke en route to emergency care via ferry from her home in Oriental. Since rescue services and the nearest hospital are about a half-hour away, the Dottie Gray Ambulance Fund has established a volunteer first-response team that can get anywhere in the district in less than five minutes. The volunteer team is equipped with a van and an automatic defibrillator.

Avery Community Foundation's Chris Juliano Memorial Fund is named after a valued member of both the local rescue squad and fire department who passed away. The fund supports the Mountain Ambulance and Health Care Foundation and its programs. Chris' family publishes a memorial

poem with his photo in a newspaper advertisement each year to ensure that his memory and the cause live on.

### Arts and culture

Funds established to support the arts and culture held by the NCCF and our affiliates throughout North Carolina are numerous and impressive. Affiliate funds help to support arts councils across the state and various artistic endeavors, from the esteemed John C. Campbell Folk School in the mountains to the famed Lost Colony outdoor drama at the coast.

The Alleghany County Community Foundation granted support to a unique venue for public art that honors the age-old tradition of quilting. The Quilt Trail, which also enjoys support from the Avery Community Foundation, winds through a growing list of Western North Carolina counties participating in this new form of experiential art and tourism. Several Midwestern and Southern states participate in this unique homage to the artistry of quilt patterns.

The heart of Hickory boasts an impressive re-purpose of the town's century-old high school called the SALT Block, an acronym for Sciences, Arts and Literature Together! The complex houses seven nonprofit and educational organizations, performing arts groups, two museums, a planetarium, an aquarium and a public library voted second-best in the state. The Unifour Foundation, a component fund of the Catawba Valley Community Foundation, has provided significant resources for this unique asset.

### Preserving the past

Historic preservation is a priority with many of our fund-holders. Statewide endowments have been created by Preservation NC and the Tryon



Palace Council of Friends. Nearly one-third of the funds held by the Bertie-Hertford Community Foundation are devoted to historic or cultural preservation efforts.

New funds for preservation established this year by Margaret Rawls Stancil will benefit the New Bern Historical Society and a similar organization in Pamlico County.

Waynesborough Historical Village enjoys support through the Wayne County Community Foundation. This recreated 19th century village near the banks of the Neuse River was once the bustling seat of Wayne County until the railroad encouraged migration to nearby Goldsboro. The Old Waynesborough Commission Endowment has helped to reconstruct and maintain the old town, which now includes several representative or relocated structures and the Tuscarora Indian Village.

### Environmental protection

The NCCF has several funds devoted to conservation and the environment. The Unifour Foundation granted \$10,000 this year to support the Foothill Conservancy's Wilson Creek protection projects. New endowments established with the Currituck-Dare Community Foundation this year are the Corolla Wild Horse Fund and Network for Endangered Sea Turtles.

The North Carolina Community Foundation and partner affiliates are proud of our impact on profound quality of life issues and the support we provide to so many important aspects of community, cultural and environmental development throughout our great state.

### Full Circle

A young musician from Catawba Valley has returned to his roots to give back. Brian Mahnke received a scholarship to attend the esteemed North Carolina School of the Arts (since renamed the UNC School of the Arts), completing his degree in music in 2003. The scholarship was made possible through a grant provided to the school through the North Carolina School of the Arts for Catawba County Fund. After graduate studies at the Eastman School of Music in New York and a brief flirtation with the food and beverage industry, he returned home to discern his next steps. Little did he know that he'd find his vocation in nearby Newton, where he serves as director of programming at the NewArt School and on the faculty, teaching saxophone and clarinet. The NewArt School is the educational programming arm of the Newton-Conover Civic and Performance Place, with a mission to promote the arts through education and programming at the facility and in partnerships with area communities and public school systems.

"I guess you could say that the community got a return on its investment," Mahnke said about the scholarship that sent him away to study music and brought him home to teach and promote the arts.

Mahnke said he is most gratified by the ability to contribute to the area's quality of life. "This kind of programming is critical in a region that is artistically underserved," he said. "Exposing adults and students to the arts is very important, not necessarily for their career development, but so they'll become patrons and donors," he said. "Building patrons is my big thing."

Several of the NewArt School's programs are funded through Unifour and the Catawba Valley Community Foundation.

the NCCF's 20-year focus on rural areas and a network that spans the state, we have long worked to make philanthropy accessible to all. Our footprint allows us to involve a growing representation of North Carolina's population in the important work of local community foundations as we engage board members, volunteers, donors and nonprofit recipients.

The bulk of our programming in recent years has been devoted to nurturing philanthropy among women and youth, often in underserved areas. Through our alliance with NCGives and its key partners, these initiatives are expanding.

## Women givers

NCCF programming centered on women has leveraged networks and the power of collective giving.

The Women's Network in Wake County boasts more than 100 members and is entering its second grants cycle, with \$104,000 to allocate. Gifts of no less than \$25,000 each will be distributed this fall to nonprofits that focus on helping women and/or children in Wake County. Remarkable is the fact that the giving group has existed for just two years. The fund represents a cross-section of female philanthropists in Wake County and even spans generations within families, as mothers, daughters and daughters-in-law connect for change.

Also focusing on women and children are the three year-old Bertie-Hertford Women's Fund and the Women Givers of Northeast North Carolina, which includes the counties of Camden, Gates, Pasquotank and Perquimans.

Just getting underway, the Women Givers of Nash-Rocky Mount has a goal of granting \$10,000 to programs for women and families its first year.

NCGives has issued a matching-gifts challenge to help the group get off the ground.

In formative stages are women's giving circles in Onslow, which will focus on women's health issues, Johnston and Wilson counties.

The NCCF's statewide Women's Fund is entering its second grants cycle and focuses on issues that have a broad impact on North Carolina. Its leadership is comprised of representatives of the NCCF's existing and emerging affiliate women's giving groups.

## Youth and philanthropy

It's no secret that younger generations have discovered the power of effecting change through volunteerism. We can add charitable giving to their expanding concept of philanthropy.

What began as an experiment in Vance County is now a full-fledged and active youth grant-making program, thanks to the partnership NCCF enjoys with NCGives, the Vance County Community Foundation and the Henderson Family YMCA. Teens with Power is the name of the Vance County youth group, now in its third year.



and going strong.

Wilkes County introduced a youth giving program last year, integrating the endeavor into the superintendent's existing advisory board of high school students. The Wilkes Youth Initiative, dubbed T3LC by the students (which stands for Time, Talent and Treasure Leading to Change), got a big jump-start through a generous gift from an anonymous donor. One of T3LC's grants funded a watering system for the local Future Farmers of America, allowing the chapter to introduce livestock to their curriculum. The impact

the program had on participants can be summed up in a joint statement made by Jessica Adams and Aaron Luck at the Wilkes Youth Celebration to commemorate T3LC's first year: "This endeavor wasn't about handing out money; it was about learning the values of giving back to one's community and changing the lives of our friends, peers and mentors for the better."

Youth initiatives also are just getting started in Rocky Mount/Edgecombe, the Catawba Valley region and Onslow, Yadkin and Northampton counties.

“What makes these youth programs truly work are the alliances we enjoy with local organizations,” said Carrie Gray, the NCCF’s director of donor engagement, who has led the charge to develop initiatives across the state. “It’s another great example of the power of networks.”

### No age limit

Teaching the concept of giving can start even earlier than high school. Take for example, an effort to acknowledge Philanthropy Day that had elementary students pooling their change to learn about the power of collective giving. Students at Winstead Avenue Elementary School in Rocky Mount brought in coins, merged their resources and voted on allocations. “If we can teach children the power of giving when they’re young, then they can change the world,” said Kelly Joyner Lee, the NCCF affiliate coordinator who organized the event.

And proving that the spirit of generosity has no age limit is Lieselotte Timmel, who at nearly 100 years young, has set up an endowment with the Moore County Community Foundation to honor her father. Ernst Ludwig Timmel was a German artist, poet and philosopher of some renown who was also credited with bringing updated lace-making manufacturing techniques to the U.S.

### Expanding ethnicities

People of color contribute a growing and significant portion of charitable dollars in the United States, and North Carolina reflects this important trend.

Dr. Carolyn Ennis established a scholarship to create a legacy for her passion for learning and Shaw University, where she received her undergraduate degree. The fund is held with the Johnston County Community Foundation.

Several scholarships created by members of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians held with their affiliate foundation help to fund the continued education of tribal youth. The George and Della Owl Award, established from the estate of Cherokee philanthropists, recognizes academic excellence beyond high school for students enrolled in the Tribal Education Program. The Bill Taylor Scholarship Endowment funds scholarships for Cherokee students interested in pursuing college business degrees.

Cola Ashe established a fund to honor his late brother and parents, who put a premium on education. M.C. Ashe was a successful builder and farmer, and his wife Bernice was an educator who taught for more than 40 years. Their emphasis on the importance of higher education resulted in Cola’s career as a high school social studies teacher and guidance counselor and his brother Frank’s profession as an electrical engineer. High school graduates from Hertford or Northampton counties who plan to pursue a four-year degree are eligible to apply for the M.C. Ashe Family Scholarship Endowment, held with the Bertie-Hertford Community Foundation.

“We live in a small, economically deprived area where education can make a big difference,” Ashe said. “My family’s been blessed. And when one’s been blessed – be a blessing to someone else.”

## Generations of Givers

There is no doubt of the significance that the heralded intergenerational transfer of wealth will have on philanthropy in the 21st century through the establishment and enrichment of funds, endowments and family foundations. Twenty years of developing stewardship at the North Carolina Community Foundation have allowed us to witness another important transition, and that is the transfer of values.

An excellent example is the Sharma family, who created a scholarship (awarded annually to a North Carolina student attending college in-state with a preference toward NC State University) to honor Dr. G.D. Sharma and the family's commitment to higher education. With a Ph.D. in entomology, Dr. Sharma taught at the high school and university levels in India, Africa and the United States for nearly 50 years. He and his wife Saroj share a passion for learning that was passed onto their now grown five children, all graduates of NC State. "We have in turn taught our children just as we were taught," daughter Madhu said. "When you get something in life, you need to give back to the community." With 10 grandchildren, the family tradition of giving back has great potential. Madhu's son Anuj Vedak, pursuing an MBA at Harvard, is among the grandchildren who have donated to the Sharma Family Scholarship and expanded the value of giving-back into the next generation.

The legacy of philanthropy also includes volunteerism. The Walstons and extended family of Wilson are known for giving time and treasure. The late D. Stuart Walston was involved in the creation of the Wilson County Community Foundation and was a founding board member.

He and wife Doris supported the community in quiet ways and established a fund with the local affiliate for their church. Son Stuart Jr., currently president of the Wilson affiliate, has continued the family legacy. He and his father established a fund to support Barton College through their renowned interior design firm, Stuart Walston, Inc. His sense of civic duty involves him in many causes. "I live here, grew up here, so I feel it's a duty to give back to the community that embraced me and helped me raise my children," he said. "It's all about ensuring that the next generation has the same opportunities that I've had." The next generation of Walstons is exploring their own community-service niche, with daughter Sarah providing valuable volunteer support for the Wilson affiliate's annual wine tasting fund-raiser. (Stuart's brother-in-law Clyde Harris Jr. serves on the NCCF's statewide board and is past-president of the Wilson affiliate board.)

A family scholarship fund to honor the late Robert E. Barnhill Sr. and various other funds established by his family acknowledge a true leader in the construction and contracting industries. Mr. B., as he was known to family and friends, achieved statewide and even national stature in the business world. He was involved in building

major highways throughout the Eastern Seaboard, and his company constructed a number of important buildings, hospitals and shopping centers. Yet he never forgot his Edgecombe County roots and remained loyal to the Tarboro area. “A mighty oak has fallen” was one of the heartfelt metaphors used to describe this much-beloved man and the community’s sense of loss upon his death. His son Robert Jr. helps to carry on the family’s business and serves on the NCCF’s statewide board.

Stories about philanthropy are also handed

down from one generation to the next, and the Allen’s lore of largesse in Montgomery County is the stuff of legend – at least within the family. Kerry Hensley, a member of the Montgomery affiliate board, says her grandfather Bernie Allen was known for borrowing money to help others when he had none of his own to share. She also witnessed her parents’ lifelong generosity, even when they didn’t have much. She recalls her parents, J.F. and Jean Allen, sponsoring children over the holidays so they could spend time with a family.

The Sharma family of Cary created a scholarship to honor Dr. G.D. Sharma and the family’s deep commitment to higher education, which now spans multiple generations. Dr. Sharma and his wife Saroj, center, are surrounded by their five grown children and their spouses and their 10 grandchildren.



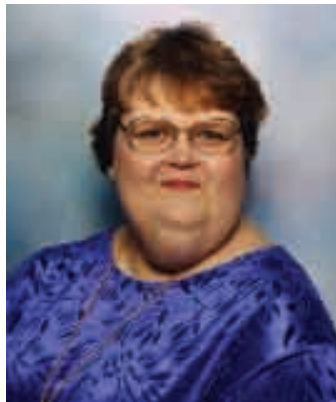

Even today her folks take time to mentor children. All three Allen siblings, now grown, are givers and doers in their own quiet ways. The J.F. and Jean Allen Family Endowment is one they all contribute to and has been established to support general charitable needs in the community, as well as educational, religious and scientific initiatives. Kerry's brother Ray and his wife Breon also have a fund with the Montgomery County affiliate.

Sometimes a family's younger generation provides the inspiration for giving. Sarah Campbell was only in her 40s when she established a bequest in her will that specified, absent family heirs, the creation of a college scholarship fund for deserving high school graduates in Graham County, one of the poorest in our state. Her untimely death due to cancer saw the estate go to her mother Della. While not obligated, Della chose to honor her daughter's inten-

A life-long educator, Sarah inspired many to enter the profession. A large group of teachers attended her funeral and sat together. When asked to signal if they had been taught by Sarah, half of the group stood to honor their mentor.

Many gifts have been established to honor the

“mighty oaks” among us: some flourishing, some fallen. Whether with us or departed, their values have been planted within the next generation like acorns that will grow into saplings that thicken and branch into a greater network of givers for years to come. The North Carolina Community Foundation is proud to have played a role in nurturing this forest of stewardship that continues to take root and grow across our state.

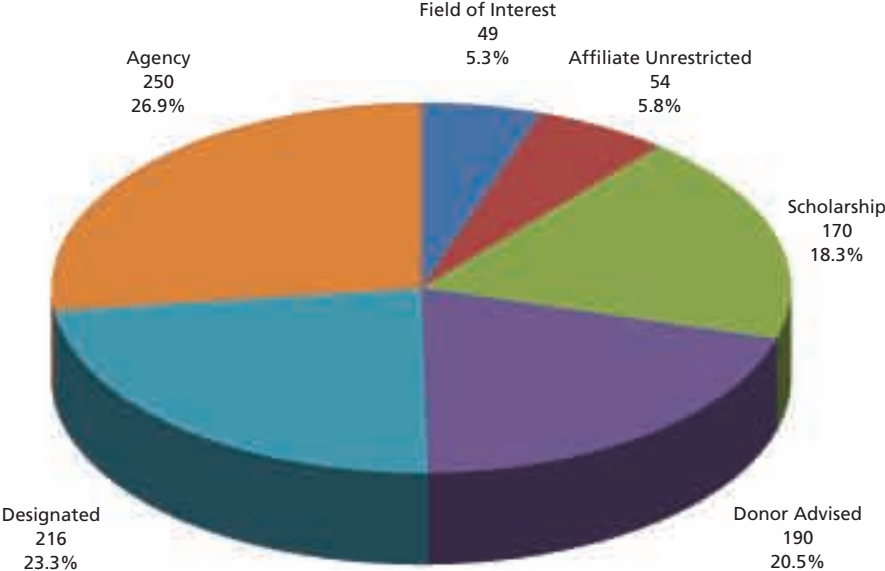

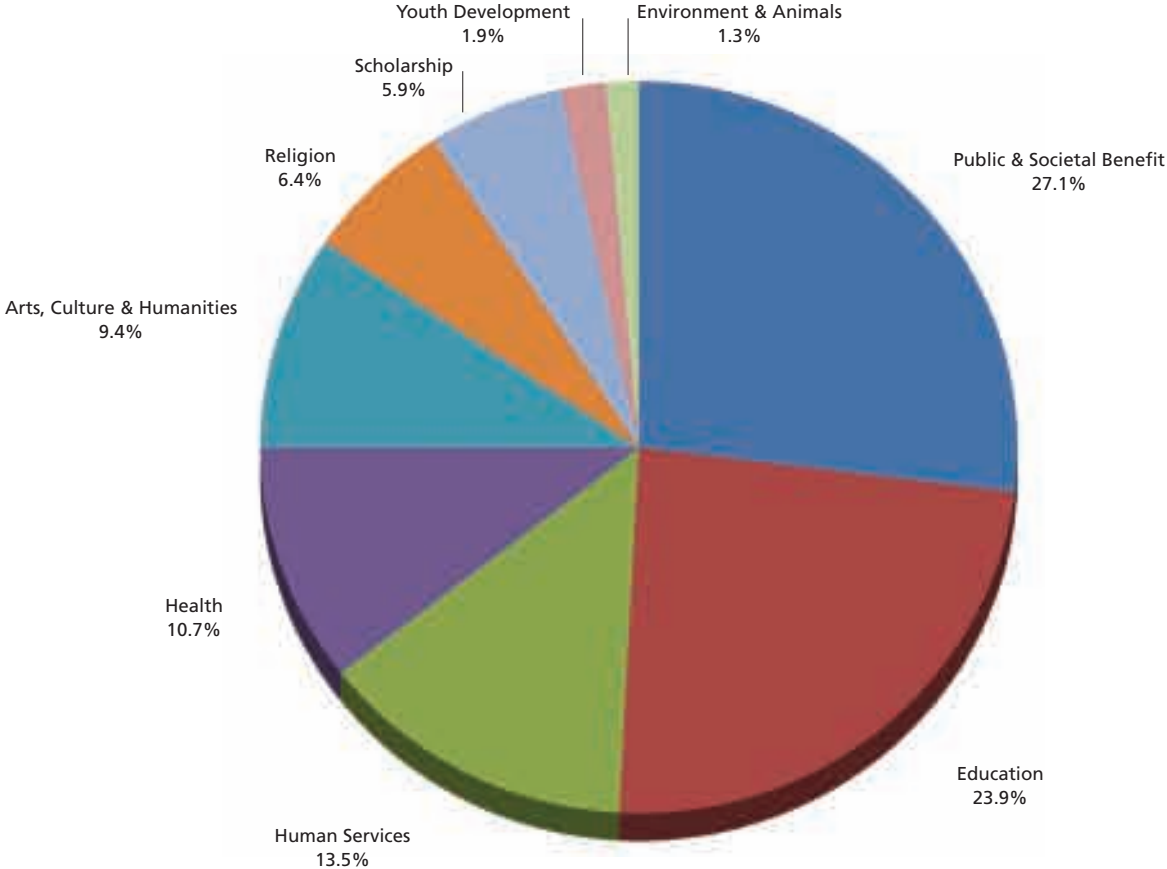

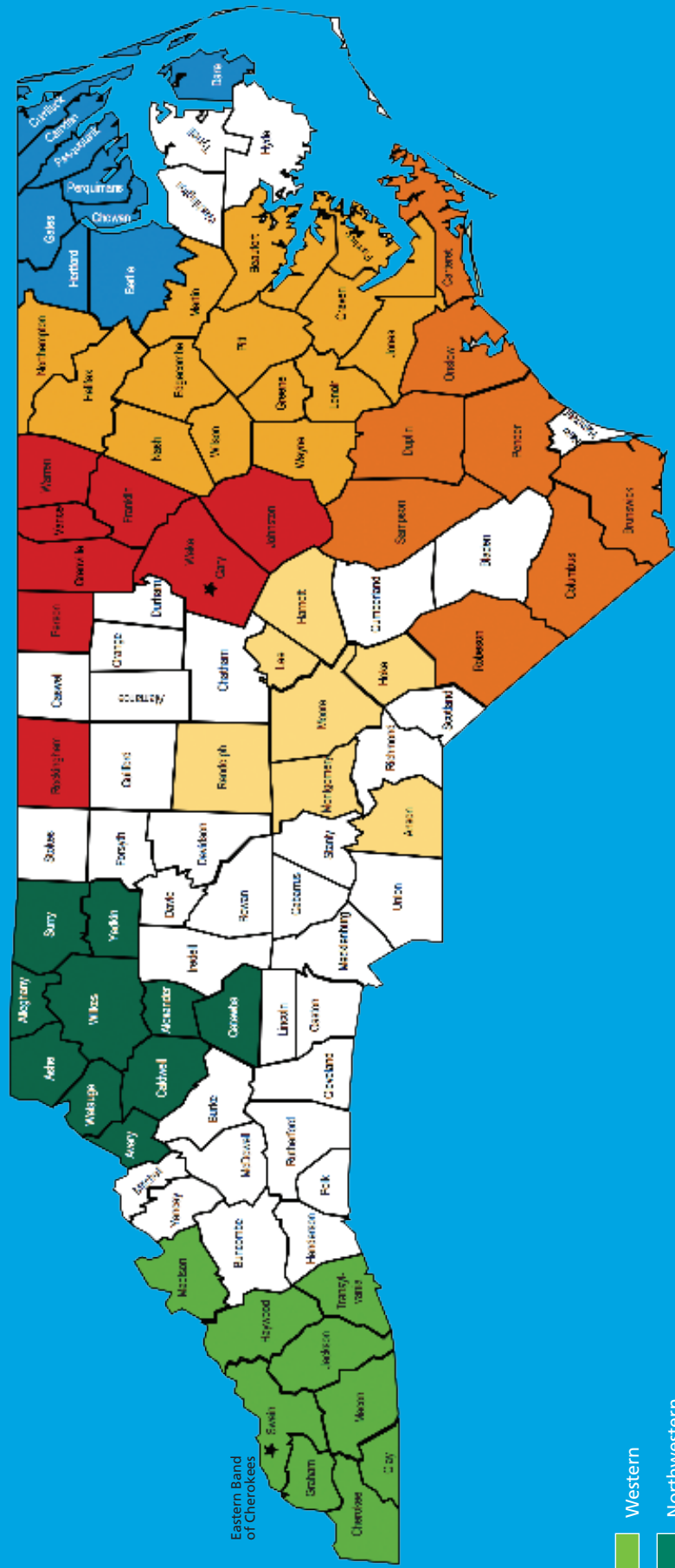
